I, _____ *Please Print Student Name* _____, intend on participating in Advanced Placement coursework this academic year at Virginia Allred Stacey Junior/Senior High School.

The Advanced Placement (AP) program is a cooperative educational endeavor between secondary schools and colleges and universities. It provides high school students exposure to college-level material and the academic rigor students can expect in higher education. AP students are then given an opportunity to show what they have learned by taking an AP Exam. Depending on student's AP exam score(s), colleges and universities often grant credit and/or placement in advanced course work. Typically, successful AP students are task-oriented, proficient readers, able to prioritize their time, and have parental support.

The content and curricular goals of each AP discipline are outlined in an AP Course Description supplied by the College Board at www.collegeboard.org. AP courses are characterized by an immersion in college-level content, an accelerated pace, and a performance assessment at the synthesis and evaluative levels. AP courses prepare students for the future by giving them tools that will serve them well throughout and beyond their college career.

According to Texas Education Agency, a **grade below 70%** in an AP class does not affect a student's eligibility for UIL activities. However, such a grade is not a passing grade in regard to satisfactory progress in an AP course, or for determination of course credit.

Virginia Allred Stacey Junior/Senior High School believes that all students have the right to participate in rigorous and challenging coursework towards college preparation. The value of AP participation in the program far exceeds simple tuition savings, and the possibility of earning college credit while in high school.

By enrolling in an AP course, students are automatically committed to participate in AP examinations each May. Students may take AP courses and elect to opt out of the associated exams. The opt out process requires students to inform their AP Teacher by November 6th.

Currently, each exam is \$94. Virginia Allred Stacey Junior/Senior High School fully sponsors all associated student testing costs. For students who fail to take an exam they have committed to, they and their family are responsible for reimbursing the school and school district the full \$94 testing fee.
